“It was a challenge to get people to attend the workshops at first. But as the time there went on we found that there was a group of young people that kept coming back. We were able to develop a bond and a unique connection with them. As with many in the community, they had lost a friend to suicide, and were very much in deep grief. It was wonderful to see how we were able to encourage them through teaching, singing and prayer. Personally I felt that if it was only that group of young people who found hope because of us being there, that would be enough.”

In Blackfoot Territory: Telling the Real Story



“Hurt people hurt people!” Recently we heard a speaker expand on this by saying, “Hurt people hurt people but healed people heal people.” Our Inenimowin Circle in Montana brought wounded healers together that are leading others along a healing journey among the Blackfeet in Montana. And it is because of God’s work in their hearts. In the Blackfeet language they have named this experience, “Itaiptsiniikiyow Circle, which means “Telling the Real Story.” One participant writes,

“Being able to go to the training has enabled me to continue to build on my foundation and actually live in the worthiness of God’s love, not only for me but for my family, friends and those who I encounter with addictions. I feel more confident and can feel a change in my heart and soul regarding the healing I have experienced from my childhood trauma. I am able to be honest and share my story with others in a good way.”

By God’s grace, My People is building First Nations leaders who are authentically following Jesus. The weekly men’s and women’s talking circles in Browning are conduits of our Creator’s redemptive love, which is bringing healing in hearts and lives.
